B1-B5 elective, C1, C2, C3, C4, D4, D5 and F. Courses in GE C4, D5 and F should be taken only after Junior standing is reached (90 units).

**Two(2) courses must be completed from B1. No HIST class may be taken to satisfy GE D5.**

<sup>1</sup> Or other language approved by the History Department. Students with fewer than three years of high school instruction in the chosen language should start at an earlier level before attempting 201. See Modern Languages & Literature Department for language placement information.

<sup>2</sup> **Minimum of 12 units** must be selected at the 400 level. HIST 400, 467, 485, 495 cannot count towards the 24 units of History electives. **Minimum of 12 units to be selected from Non-US, Non-European HIST courses (see catalog for list of options).**

<sup>3</sup> Upper Division GE courses taken for a letter grade satisfy Major or Support course requirements which would cause Free Electives to become 41 or more units, rather than 29 units to complete the 180 unbit total degree requirement. Some free electives may need to be 300-400 level to ensure completion of required minimum 60 units of upper division. Consult college advisor for more information.
